Cllr McKinney gave a short update to the members on the Neighbourhood Plan.

Cllr McKinney explained that there would be a public consultation mid to late November on the Core items of the plan.

Cllr A Kelly commented that the consultation material needs to be understandable.

Cllr H Crawford commented that all material must have the approval of the Town Council before It goes to consultation.

2667P To receive an update on the proposed meeting with Barret/David Wilson Homes

The clerk informed members that he was looking toward a date in October. The members Were of the general opinion that the clerk should arrange a suitable date and inform the Members.

2668P To discuss two issues raised by local residents

Cllr Eveleigh had prepared a presentation for the members on an issue relating to Church Walk.

The resident had encountered issues with vehicles parking directly outside her front window

Which faced on to Church Walk. The resident had made contact with Cllr Eveleigh to see if any resolution could be found to this problem. The resident had suggested that a small length of yellow lining would solve the problem

The clerk confirmed that the area of concern was SKDC owned.

Cllr R Baker commented that he would see what he could achieve as this was SKDC owned.

One of the solutions that was discussed was the placing of a planter in the vicinity that should ease the problem. The clerk said that he would investigate this solution.

The second issue was raised by the clerk who informed members that residents were being told by LCC that the issuing of TRO's was the responsibility of the Parish/Town Council.

The clerk was tasked with clarifying this matter.

Proposed by Cllr B Johnson, seconded by Cllr N Eveleigh, and unanimously. **RESOLVED:** To receive the above information and the clerk to investigate: a) the possibility of a planter being placed on Church Walk b) to clarify the situation with LCC with regard to TRO's.

2669P Climate Change

Cllr Kelly asked for a copy of the Town Council climate policy. The clerk explained that the Town Council had never adopted a climate policy but had made a declaration of climate Emergency.

Cllr Kelly asked if she should ask a local resident to come and talk to the Town Council re Climate change.

Cllr Kelly continued that we need to be thoughtful when we make our budgetary decisions taking into consideration the impact on climate.

The clerk informed members that the topic had been previously discussed and whilst it had been agreed that we should make every effort to minimise any climate impact it was felt that unlike the District Council there was little we could do.

Cllr Kelly commented that the clerk had already taken positive steps by not running off reams Of paper but utilizing email and also not delivering the relevant paperwork.

Cllr Kelly thought that other measures should be considered and informed the members that some time ago she had suggested a green cemetery but nothing had come of it but that it was something we should push for.

Cllr R Baker informed members that the Planet Change consultation had recently closed and the conclusions were being assessed. Cllr Baker continued that SKDC are about to publish their carbon budget for the last financial year and that certain changes are being looked at:

- 1) All machinery to be battery powered
- 2) Covers to swimming pools
- 3) Photovoltaic cells to be added to the roofs of Council Properties
- 4) Funding to be available for Town Councils to allow for local climate action

Cllr Kelly asked Cllr Baker about the trees planted by SKDC that were allowed to die. Cllr Baker responded that he was told that the trees had been lost due to the unseasonably warm weather we had that year and there was not sufficient budget to continue watering. Cllr Baker Said that he was continuing to pursue this matter.

Proposed by Cllr P Fellows, seconded by Cllr H Crawford, and unanimously. **RESOLVED: To receive the above report information and add the subject to the next amenities agenda.**
