2829P To receive an update on revised planning timescales from SKDC and the impact on BTC H&P

Cllr R Baker reported that SKDC have changed their timescale on receiving applications and commenting. It will not be possible to comment on every application if the current allocation of meeting times for the H&P Committee remains, resulting in more frequent planning agenda items at other meetings. Need to think about how we can still provide a voice for Bourne.

2830P To receive the first draft copy of an updated and resident friendly 'Highways and Planning Committee Terms of Reference' ahead of formal discussion at a future meeting.

Cllr R Baker asked Councillors to take the document away with them and report back with any comments/edits.

Cllr N Oglesbee responded that the 'cheat sheet' included in the draft is invaluable for Councillors when considering planning applications.

Cllr P Fellows added that the information is necessary and helps members of the public learn what material considerations are relevant to applications.

Cllr A Kelly queried page 5 - who can attend meetings, is it just Bourne residents? Surely anyone can attend, not just residents of Bourne.

Proposed by Cllr B Johnson, seconded by Cllr N Eveleigh Resolved: To receive information.

2831P To receive an update on SKDC's Draft Local Plan Consultation (to include BTCs response and next steps.

Cllr R Baker reported that BTC response has been submitted and is now part of public record.

Timeline: Regulation 19 Pre Submission Jan – Feb (possible Mar) 2026. The council considers all comments received during this stage.

Nov 26 – Submits plan to the inspectorate.

Nov 26-Oct 27 - An independent planning inspector conducts an examination to assess the local plan's soundness, legal compliance, and whether it meets national planning requirements.

Oct 27 - The inspector publishes a report detailing whether the plan is sound.

Nov 27 – Adoption. If the inspector deems the plan sound, the local authority can then formally adopt it, making it the basis for future planning decisions.
